EAST KNOX FFA COMPETES IN STATE ANIMAL MANAGEMENT CDE

Recently, on November 14, two East Knox FFA members competed in the State Animal Management Career Development Event held in the Kasich Building at the Ohio Exposition Center in Columbus where they placed 18th out of a group of teams from across Ohio. Team members were freshmen Ava Page and Miranda Fawcett. Individually, Page placed 18th, just four points out of the top ten, and Fawcett finished 20th out of 121 individuals. The top ten teams and individuals receive awards.

To qualify for the State finals the participants had to place in the top 150 scores in the online general knowledge test taken prior to the state event with questions over dogs, cats, rabbits, guinea pigs, chinchillas, ferrets, amphibians, reptiles, birds, hedgehogs, sugar gliders, and pocket pets. 867 students in the state completed the online examination.

At the finals members had to identify dog breeds, small and large varieties of birds, reptiles and amphibians, breeds of cats, rodents and miscellaneous animals, breeds of rabbits, bird feeds, dog and cat products and supplies, bird products and supplies, reptile and amphibian products and supplies, and small animal products and supplies. Additionally, each contestant performed four practicums. The practicums consisted of handling and sexing hamsters, selecting cages and accessories for rabbits, explaining and evaluating nutrition requirements of painted turtles, and recognizing and evaluating health requirements of canaries. The categories are the pocket pet practicum, the dog/cat/guinea pig/chinchilla/ferret/hedgehog/sugar glider practicum, the reptile and amphibian practicum, and the bird practicum.

The purpose of the Animal Management Career Development Event is to provide students the opportunity to demonstrate knowledge and skills associated with companion animals in the pet industry. This is the third time that East Knox FFA has had a team in the State Animal Management CDE finishing 18th all three times.

Winter Sports Report

Girls Basketball

This was a growing year for the Bulldogs Girls Basketball Team with only one Senior on the roster (**Jayden Annett**) and a lot of younger Bulldog players getting playing time. The girls finished the season with a 7-16 overall record (3-9 in the KMAC) which resulted in a 6th place finish in the conference. In the playoffs, the Bulldogs battled, but fell on the road in the Sectional Final to #1 seed Mechanicsburg. Multiple players earned postseason awards on the season including: **Sydney Opfer** who was named KMAC 1st Team and District 11 First Team; **Isabelle Bostic** who was named KMAC Honorable Mention and District 11 Honorable Mention and **Jayden Annett** who was named KMAC All-Academic.

Swimming

We had only one swimmer this year, Senior **Hiba Ezzarouali** who practiced and competed with the Mount Vernon squad. Hiba has improved dramatically over the last 3 years in swim, and focused on mainly freestyle and back events her senior season. At the Sectional meet at Columbus School for Girls, Hiba finished 26th in the 100 Free and 20th in the 100 Backstroke. Considering there are only two divisions in swimming, those are excellent times against very tough competition! While she didn't move on to Districts, **Hiba Ezzarouali** improved tremendously during her time in swimming!

Boys Basketball

The Boys Basketball team had a tough season this year, compounded by injuries to their senior leaders. Therefore, the younger players on the team needed to step up and compete as hard as they could throughout the season and improved as the season progressed including a win at Danville. The team as a whole went 3-20 on the season (2-10 in the KMAC) resulting in a 7th place finish in the conference. In the playoffs, the Bulldogs fell in the Sectional Final to #1 seed Columbus Academy. **Corbin Poff-Wengerd** was named KMAC 2nd team while **Bryer Korosec** was named KMAC Honorable Mention and **Ethan Rine** named to the KMAC All-Academic Team.

Wrestling

This year, we had two wrestlers competing and practicing with the Mount Vernon Team: **Senior Dmetrius Negron** and **Junior Blake Elliott**. Both worked very hard throughout the season, and improved in time for the playoffs. At the KMAC Tournament, Blake was the 190 lb. champion and was named by the KMAC as the Wrestler of the KMAC Tournament. At Sectionals, Blake repeated the championship run by winning his 190 lb. weight class. Unfortunately, Dmetrius was knocked out at Sectionals after competing hard all season. In Blake's case, he continued on the tournament trail finishing in 3rd at Districts, punching his ticket to States. At the State Championship, Blake became the first wrestler on the podium in East Knox history, finishing 6th and securing All-Ohio honors. Great job Blake!

Bowling

The Bowling Teams had an amazing year, with the boys team repeatedly breaking school records, and winning back-to-back KMAC titles following an undefeated season. The girls team also had an excellent season, finishing 2nd in the KMAC, and then winning the KMAC Tournament at the end of the year. The Boys team finished 2nd at Sectionals, 2nd at Districts and then finished 12th at the State Championship-the first time ANY East Knox Bowling team has made the State Championship. As a result, for the first time ever all 5 starting boys bowlers (Will Jensen, Lane Lashley, Blake Calhoon, Dylan Reed and Jordan Hull) SWEPT the KMAC 1st Team Honors, and Head Coach Chip Pozderac was named KMAC Boys Bowling Coach of the Year. In addition, Will Jensen was named the KMAC Bowler of the Year and Jordan Hull was named KMAC All-Academic. For the Girls Team, Olivia Nastasi was named KMAC 1st Team; KMAC Girls Bowler of the Year and KMAC All-Academic. In addition, Miale Hurlow was named KMAC 1st Team and McKayla Blakely was named KMAC 2nd Team. On the playoff trail at the District Championship, Olivia Nastasi rolled a 572 series and finished 3rd, qualifying her for the State Championship, making Olivia the first girl in East Knox history to make the State Championship. Olivia finished 27th at the State Championship with a 534 series. Congratulations to both bowling teams on a truly historic season!
