# East Knox Local School District From the School Board Members

Dear East Knox Community,

In the life of every school comes a time when a critical decision can change the course of the district for the better or for the worse. The time for that decision for East Knox is now. Your board is proposing building a new high school and we wanted to convey to you why we believe that now is the time.

#### **Past Success**

First of all, thank you for your past support. The School Board is making the funds from the previous operating levy last far into the future. All schools prepare a 5-year forecast with standard accounting processes. The Board's original goal after passing the levy was to maintain, at the end of 5 years, a cash balance of 30% of East Knox's yearly revenue. Good fiscal policy and prudent investment of your tax dollars has the forecast now showing a balance of 53% at the end of East Knox's 5-year forecast. The improved forecast could prolong the need for future operations levies.

#### Current Jr./Sr. High School

The original building was built in 1938 and has served this community for almost 82 years. Multiple additions give us the current building's many roof lines and an odd layout. The design of much of the building was before energy saving concepts were developed. Roofing insulation has broken down causing ponding instead of draining. Electrical distribution is inadequate for modern usage and certainly not capable of air conditioning. Brick work needs repaired, windows need replaced, and many other items need upgraded. During the years of financial emergency little investment was made in this facility in order to avoid additional deficit spending. Areas such as the roof are in dire need of attention. Our facilities coordinator expects that we could easily spend several million dollars on repairs over the next 5 years. This would have a very adverse effect on our operational finances resulting in an early return to the voters for operational funding. The district would require another levy while still having a very old, inefficient, and out-dated facility. The state assessment to completely renovate the existing building was 13.66 million dollars.

#### The Plan

Administration and the Board have spent 6 months in community engagement meetings where lots of options were considered. Ultimately, we decided to replace the Jr/Sr High school building leaving the 1994 addition. The '94 section of the school would be the oldest facility on campus. East Knox's facilities issues would be behind our community for more than a generation. Operational money would be spared before a large investment in building repair would occur. The new facility would be designed for simplicity, durability, and functionality. The new high school would have air conditioning including the '94 section that houses the gym and cafeteria. A two-year construction project would occur. Utilities

and their related systems such as gas, septic, water, and electric that are currently problematic would be replaced. New roofs will be pitched (not flat) and metal for longevity. A preschool program would return to East Knox. It's important that we keep our students in the district so that your tax dollars are not sent to other districts. The School Board believes returning the pre-school will limit future open enrollment losses and help East Knox fulfill our state mandates in this area. During construction the affected students would temporarily be put into modular classrooms for part of their class time. The school would try to keep the '94 section open during the school year with improvements made during the summer.

#### Cost

Architects estimate the cost of the project at \$19 million dollars. This would be spread over 37 years. The millage required to cover our bond would be 3.3 mills. That amount equals \$115.50 per \$100,000 in property valuation per year. In order to keep the cost low, the Board has decided NOT to include any unnecessary spaces such as a 3rd gym or auditorium. Our proposal is to replace the necessary classroom space and to streamline the building.

#### Why Now?

It is important for taxpayers to understand that unlike the operational levy there is NO plan to ask the voter every year for a new facility. If the voters say no, the Board will assume that you are telling us to spend the District's operations money on repairing the old facility. The Board believes it is unwise to spend large amounts of money repairing a very old building and then returning to the community in five or ten years to ask for a new facility. The next time would be at a dramatically higher cost as building costs continue to rise dramatically. We can save the repair cost now, have lower maintenance cost in the future, take advantage of historically low bond rates, provide a better learning environment, and save taxpayers millions of dollars by building now instead of waiting another 5 or 10 years. Timing is important in business and we believe that applies to our school also. Your vote this November will help determine the direction of the district for many years to come!

#### The East Knox School Board

Dear Parents, Students and Community Members,

Welcome to another exciting school year! As you no doubt noticed, our lead article in this summer's edition is the letter from the Board of Education discussing our bond issue this November. I am impressed that the 3.30 millage was so low for a \$19 million project. It's not uncommon that those projects push upwards of 7 or 8 mills. The requested 3.30 millage reflects the Board's common sense approach to building a quality, functional educational space that will meet the needs of our students for decades to come. I recently spoke to a resident who stated, "I graduated from that building (the current Junior/Senior High School) 50 years ago and it needed torn down then."

I have seen a number of levy issues through the years. Levy committee approaches sometimes focus on what someone has to give up to pass a levy. For example: "You only have to give up a pizza a month" or "It'll only cost you a cup of coffee per day." In my experience, voters want to know what they're going to get for their money and not what is going to be taken away. So the bond issue for this November really boils down to which direction we'll proceed to address our students' educational needs based on our voters. The way I personally frame the issue is: Can you spare under \$9.63 per month (on a \$100,000 home) to help out our students?"

We continue planning for this November's bond issue and its implications for this opportunity to complete this beautiful campus. However, I assure you that we are just as focused on getting ready for the arrival of our students for their first day of school on August 14th. We are in the middle of a several hundred thousand dollar lighting project that involves almost every area on campus with the exception of the Junior/Senior High. We should reach the break-even point in energy savings in approximately 6.3 years. We are also making improvements in energy efficiency with our boiler system at the Elementary School in addition to normal cleaning, scrubbing and new paint campus wide. We'll address parking lot surfaces this month with repairs/sealing/striping as needed which includes this campus and our Bladensburg ball field property as well.

We are looking forward to the return of our students for another educationally fulfilling year. Even though it is just mid-July as I write this, sounds of the fall are already happening as our growing marching band begins their preparations in earnest. Sports teams will be in full stride very soon as well. It should be a very exciting fall.

That's the news for now. I hope you have a great remainder of your summer!

# PowerSchool Parent Accounts and Submitting Online Student Forms



East Knox has been transitioning to **ONLINE Student Handbooks**, **Acceptable Use Policy**, **Medical Emergency** and **Open Enrollment forms** system over the past school year. The district is fully transitioned to online registration platform, which is accessed and completed through the **Parent-PowerSchool login**. Paper forms of this type will **no longer be accepted**, these forms **MUST BE completed online**. **The portal will be available to parents starting August 5th**.

PowerSchool Portal: You will use the link below to access your child's current grades, grade cards, homework, attendance, and student fees. You will also access and complete online forms through this portal.

If your child is <u>new to our district</u> and you do not have a PowerSchool Parent account, please contact Alicia Simmons (Jr/Sr High; 740-599-7000 ext. 2004) or Donna Buckingham (Elementary; 740-599-7000 ext. 3002) **AFTER AUGUST 5th** for your "Access ID" and "Access Password" in order to register and complete the online forms using the instructions below:

#### (If you <u>already have</u> a PowerSchool account skip to Step 5)

- 1. When you click the link above to the student parent portal you will see tabs to sign in or create an account.
- 2. Click the "create account" tab.
- 3. You will then add your information, email, etc in the "Parent Account Details" section. Create your ID and password (ID and passwords may be the same and must be at least 6 characters long).
- 4. Below the "Parent Account Details" section you will see the "*Link Students to Account*" section. You will enter each of your students along with their "Access ID" and "Access Password." You may link multiple students.
- 5. To fill out student forms, click the icon in the upper right hand corner of the screen. Click on the text "Submit & View Online Forms." Then click on the text "Student Demographics & EMA" to complete your student's forms. Once you have completed all fields click "Save and Submit to District."
- 6. To add a student to an existing account go to account preference, profile/students, click on students, click add and follow directions in Step 4.

If you have already created a PowerSchool Parent account you can sign in at <a href="https://ps-ek.metasolutions.net/public/home.html">https://ps-ek.metasolutions.net/public/home.html</a> and skip to Step 5 above to complete your child's forms.

As a reminder and for **any new students** to the district, East Knox Local Schools has switched from paper report cards to online report cards for all students Kindergarten through 12th grade. Instead of your child forgetting to bring home a printed report card, you will be able to log into your Parent Portal Account and see their grade card as soon as they are ready. You will also be able to print from that screen if you desire. Your child will be able to log in from their account and see the same information. **Each quarter we will notify you when grade cards are ready to be viewed. Grade cards are usually ready the first Friday after the guarter ends.** 

If you don't have a username and password or need assistance with these new procedures, please contact the school and they will be happy to help you with the process.

# Transportation Rules

#### **Bus Route Pick-up and Drop Off Rules**

Parents must designate one pick-up and one drop-off location where your child(ren) will be picked up and dropped off each day of the week. These can be two different locations for morning and afternoon. For example, your student gets on the bus at home every morning and dropped off to a babysitter every day in the afternoon. We cannot drop off/pick up students at multiple locations throughout each week. We understand shared parenting situations and will continue to adhere to those custody arrangements.
