Greetings!

What another incredible summer at East Knox! You should drive by the school campus if you have not done so recently to see at all the many changes over the past several years. The modular trailers that housed our Jr/Sr High students the last 18 months or thereabouts have been disassembled and are in the removal process. Construction workers continue to finish up the current Jr/Sr High School project both inside and outside. The remaining portion of the indoor project is installation of the Jr/Sr High School Gymnasium floor and bleachers. The new floor looks absolutely incredible!

On that note, we will dedicate the new Jr/Sr High building on Labor Day, Monday, September 5th at noon in the Gym. Please join us as we celebrate this momentous milestone and give everyone the chance to tour the entire building from the conclusion of the dedication ceremony through 3:00 p.m. that day.

Some of the rest of this article was in our last Purple Pride, however, it is certainly worth repeating especially since the Board approved the Elementary Addition project at their June 23rd meeting.

East Knox received just over \$3.2 million late last summer in Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III) from the federal government. The Board is able to use \$2.6 million of these funds towards building additional Elementary educational space without any additional cost to our taxpayers. The project will include eight new classrooms that will greatly alleviate current overcrowded conditions within the building. The new addition should be ready for students and staff at the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year. We expect to break ground on this project before Labor Day at the latest.

Once again, it continues to be an exciting time for our East Knox community. Our students will continue to thrive thanks to the generosity, foresight and thoughtfulness of this incredible community that makes us all proud to be Bulldogs!




Graduating classes of 2022 and 2034

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

Athletic Department News

Baseball

The baseball team had another successful season, finishing the regular season with a record of 15-6 overall and 8-4 in the KMAC, good enough for 3rd in the conference. In the postseason, the Bulldogs defeated Harvest Prep 20-0 in the Sectional Final, and then defeated Madison Christian by the score of 2-1 at home in the District Semifinal. Unfortunately, the Bulldogs fell to Fairfield Christian Academy 7-5 in the next game, finishing the season as District Runner-Ups. While the athletes received many honors, **Peyton Lester** and **Bryar Householder** received the highest honor, with both of them being named 2nd Team All-Ohioans. Congratulations to our baseball squad and their coaches on a very successful spring season!

Softball

The softball team had an excellent season, and dramatically improved as the season progressed. The Bulldogs finished the regular season at 13-10 overall and 6-7 in a very tough KMAC this year. Playing those tough teams paid off, however, as the Bulldogs went on a tear once they hit the playoffs. After shutting out Sectional opponent Harvest Prep 15-0, the Bulldogs also shut out Ridgedale in the District Semifinal by a score of 10-0. Next up in the District Final was Newark Catholic, and the Bulldogs rose to the challenge winning the first District Softball title in East Knox history by a score of 6-1 over the Green Wave. Unfortunately, our softball team fell in the Regional Semifinal to #1 Russia by a score of 7-5, but nothing can take away from the historic accomplishments this year. In addition, pitcher **Maddy Cotsamire** was named All-Ohio Honorable Mention for the season. Congratulations to our softball athletes and their coaching staff on a remarkable campaign this spring!

Track

The track team had an amazing season, with a remarkable run in the postseason. At KMACs, our boys team finished 2nd and our girls finished 4th. In all, 16 Bulldog track athletes received KMAC honors at the Championship meet. At Districts in Granville, our boys finished 3rd, with our girls 7th and as a result, seven of our Bulldogs advanced to the Regional Meet at Chillicothe Southeastern HS for their shot at getting to the State Championship. Our Bulldogs responded and the 4 X 800 team and 4 X 400 team both made the State meet, as well as **Nathan Streby** and **Dillon Moreland** in the 800 meter run. In Columbus at Jesse Owens Stadium, our Bulldogs shined. In all three events, our athletes made the state podium, a remarkable accomplishment.

The team of **Samuel Whitney**, **Logan Whitney**, **Dillon Moreland** and **Nathan Streby** finished 5th in the 4 X 800 Relay on Friday. On Saturday, **Nathan Streby** ran a school record time of 1:53.49 and finished as State Runner-up getting the silver, while Senior **Dillon Moreland** finished 6th in the race to receive his medal on the podium as well. Later that day, the 4 X 400 team of **Samuel Whitney**, **Hayden Baker**, **Dillon Moreland** and **Nathan Streby** finished in 8th place for the day, resulting in more medals. At the end of the State meet, the Bulldogs had five athletes named All-Ohioans, including Senior **Samuel Whitney** twice, and Senior **Dillon Moreland** and **Nathan Streby** as THREE time All-Ohioans. Congratulations to all of our Track athletes on a historic and record breaking Track season this Spring.




